He is Risen!

FROM THE LAY READER

The Resurrection of Jesus is at the very heart of the Christian faith. It's the greatest miracle in the Bible, and is mentioned in the New Testament over 100 times. As Paul says, "if Christ was not raised, your faith is futile!" (1 Corinthians 15:17).

In 1930, Frank Morison started to write a book disproving the Resurrection. He felt that the evidence for Christ rising from the dead rested on insecure foundations. A remarkable thing happened as he was researching for the book. The sheer force of the evidence compelled him to write a book proving that Christ did rise from the dead. The first chapter is entitled, "The book that refused to be written". The book became the classic "Who Moved the Stone?". Ninety-four years later it is still in print!

There is plenty of written evidence that Jesus underwent the brutal execution of a slave as was the custom in the Roman Empire. All four Gospels describe the crucifixion; and the Jewish historian Josephus, in 90 AD, wrote "Jesus the so-called Christ, was condemned by Pilate to the cross; and he appeared to them on the third day, alive again."

But it is the experience of millions of

witnesses, beginning with Peter, Thomas and the other disciples, that is the most conclusive evidence of the Resurrection.

As Jesus was being subjected to an illegal trial, cowardly Peter denied being an associate of Jesus (Mark 14:66); and after Jesus died, the frightened disciples hid behind locked doors (John 20:19) for fear of the authorities. But when the risen Jesus appeared to them, their mood changed. "They were overjoyed". All except Thomas. It was a week before Thomas met Jesus, and openly proclaimed, "My Lord and my God!"

This joy and confidence continued for 25 years as told in the Acts of the Apostles, as they spoke (Acts 2:31), proclaimed (4:2), testified (4:33) and preached (17:18) the good news about Jesus and the resurrection. Tradition tells us, that when the going got really tough, the apostles gave their lives for the Faith.

The fact that the early church changed the day of worship from the 7th to the 1st day of the week, the day Jesus rose (Acts 20:7), is significant because so many were Jewish converts who had been brought up to worship on the 7th, the Sabbath. The growth of Christianity from 12 frightened disciples to about 3,000 at Pentecost 50 days later, and to 4 million by 325 AD in

times of harsh opposition is another miracle in itself.

If Jesus rose from the dead, then he is alive today. We can meet him in worship and prayer and know him. Jesus is the living Saviour who changes lives.


