CAN YOU HELP US REPAIR THE CHURCH?

If you've recently walked up Green Lane, you will have seen the area on the end of the church from which flints have fallen, possibly due to Storm Ciarán and probably due to 170 years of wear and tear. Our architect has estimated that the repair will cost almost £25,000.

We are pursuing grants to help meet this target. The Friends of Aldham Church have £5,000 available for the repairs and we have been fortunate to get a similar grant of £5,000 from Colchester Deanery Charitable Trust. There are 4 or



5 other trusts that have helped us in the past, and we will be appealing to them shortly. However it is the practice of most grant-awarding trusts to help those who help themselves by local fundraising.

Hence this appeal to church and village.

If we can raise £3,000 we will be about half-way there. This would give us a lot of brownie points when we come to appeal to other grant-awarding bodies. We've been promised £1,000 towards this appeal, so we are looking for just

£2,000. Twenty readers of the newsletter giving £100 each would do it! But, of course, we will be grateful for all donations.

The area where the flints fell has been fenced off, for safety.

It is obvious that the repair work should be done as soon as possible, but not when there is a risk of frost. The architect is looking at April or May 2024 for the work to be done.

We will, of course, put in a claim from our insurance but it will be hard to blame the damage on the weather.

WHAT THE ARCHITECT SAYS

If you wish to see more details of the repair job, here are two extracts from his report:

Existing condition:

This inspection was carried out following a fall of flint facing from above the window in the chancel east elevation. Refer to photograph. The area of detached flint facing includes a decorative stone with a blind quatrefoil motif. The thickness of the facing varies from approx. 125 – 175mm revealing a brick and flint core. Around the edges of the fallen area, a clear void can be seen between the flint facing and core of approx. 25 - 75mm and there is little evidence that the flint has been tied to the core with bonding flints or by any other means. There is however no evidence of recent movement of the face below the tiled verges nor any movement between the flint facing and the stonework surround to the window. There is also little or no evidence of any other areas of bulging flintwork on the remaining flint face nor any cracks through the flint facing.

Recommendations for repair:

a fixed scaffolding needs to be erected with particular attention being paid to RAMS (Risk Assessments and Method Statement) due to the risk of further masonry falls. Given the relative size of

the fallen area and the evidence of a void between the facing and core, it is recommended that the whole of the gable is refaced bounded by the roof tile verges, the head of the East window down to the level of the window arch springing line and extending out to the top of the buttresses. The existing flints should be re-used and the decorative gable stone reinstated. The flint facing will need to be tied back to the brick and flint core using stainless steel ties. If any additional flints are required, then these must match the existing in size and form.
