IAN SCOTT-THOMPSON WRITES ...

Dear Friends,

I don't know if you've heard ... but apparently there's an Election coming! The Church of England has produced a little booklet of prayers (or daily emails) called "Pray Your Part" (reminding you to "Play Your Part" with prayer!) How can we get ourselves ready to vote?

At its most basic level, engaging in politics can simply be turning up to vote at elections. I suspect this is something Christians are already good at. 93% of Christian respondents to a recent survey said they are certain or likely to turn up to vote in the next general election.

However, for many of us, perhaps we turn up to vote because it is our civic duty but we do not give much thought to how we use our vote. We vote for 'X' party because it's the party we have always voted for. It might even be the party our parents always voted for too. Or maybe we have consulted a trusted friend who "knows their stuff" about politics, and plan to ask how they will vote because surely that must be a safe choice?

I suggest that if we are to be good stewards of our vote, and make full use of it, we should give more serious thought to who we vote for. We can start by taking some time to pray to God and consider what are some of the big themes that Scripture suggests we should care about

(e.g. issues like poverty and the sanctity of life are themes that are threaded throughout the bible). Once you have thought of a few policy areas that you feel called to care about, start looking at what each of the parties are saying (or not saying) about these things. Think about some of the big issues facing society today from God's perspective.

When considering how we vote, it is good to remember the advice to Christ's followers in Philippians 2:3-4: "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."

The good news is that many Christians are already thinking about others as they cast their vote. 58% of respondents to that survey said that one of the top factors determining the way they vote is which party they believe will best help others who are most in need. Only 11% said they vote for the party that will most help themselves and their family.

Of course, it's complicated: we're not just voting for a national leader to be Prime Minister, with national policies, but also a local MP with local policies. Our vote has several aspects to it, including the previous history of results in our area.

Let's pray, then, for a good and fair election process; and let's pray that our future Government will lead our country well, in the coming years!

EAST END GABLE REPAIRS

The emergency repairs were finished on 15 May and all invoices were paid by 14 June. Thanks again to the wonderful support of the village for the Appeal, and to Bakers, the builder, for coming in below their tender offer. We did not need to use the Friends of Aldham Church Funds to pay the bills.

Furthermore, there was a small surplus which we offered back to two donors to the Appeal, which they refused to take!

When we get the refund of VAT on the bills, we will have nearly £4,000 to be spent on completing the remaining jobs from the 2021 quinquennial survey. The work is in four categories:

Internal window decoration
External rainwater gutters
Repainting external flint-work
Treatment of pews and pulpit for
woodworm and beetle damage

Ken Thompson and I are already working on this multi-job project which has the support of the PCC and will need additional grants.

OPEN GARDENS WEEKEND

The weather on 15 and 16 June was quite kind: showery in the morning but sunny in the afternoons. About 276 visitors came from all over Essex on the two days and the Village Hall team sold out of Ploughman's Lunches on Sunday. Lunches and garden teas made £1,140 while Plant sales made £144. There was a steady flow of visitors to the church to see the Art Exhibition. Sale of pictures made £102, books and jigsaws £95, Crafts £30, and the Donations bucket in the church took £105. Sponsors, listed on the back of the programme gave £330. At the end of the weekend the net proceeds was a magnificent £3,500.

When a small community, such as Aldham, opens itself to the public for an OGW, it involves many people who don't get their names in the programme. So we want to say a huge thank you to everyone who cut their lawn, tidied up their front garden, helped at a neighbour's garden, spread the word to friends, baked a cake or scones, served tea in a neighbour's garden, washed up at the village hall, put up garden number boards and parking signs, sat in the church, set up the Art Exhibition, swept up in the village hall, and many many more
