IAN SCOTT-THOMPSON WRITES ...

Dear Friends.

'I come to your church', people tell me. Now I sometimes have trouble remembering names. But I don't remember ever having seen the person who just pledged allegiance to 'my' church. Somewhat helplessly I ask some careful follow up questions. Which church? (we have six church buildings), and also when?

The clarifications put my own mind and doubts of insanity at rest. It turns out they used to attend occasionally at Christmas for midnight communion or even on Easter Sunday. I feel relieved, but only momentarily.

Can I simply say: if that's you, please read on. Because we - I - need you.

At crucial times we want to be here for you: when you want to affirm your or your children's faith in baptism, when you want to get married or when you have to say good bye to your loved one, but we can't do it alone.

The Christian church isn't just there for special occasions: it's about God, people and a way of life 365 days a year. Church is not a building, it's really the people who come and work out together what it means to follow Jesus - which is what it means to be a Christian. And if you are among those who say: 'Church is not for me', I would ask, 'Why not?' Is it because you think it's irrelevant, boring and out of date? Please come and help us change that. Is it because you are not sure what to believe? Well, that would be most of us. We find comfort in what God promises us in his word, but we too wrestle with doubts, sometimes with life in general and don't have easy answers. What we try to do is allow God's love to change us and to serve others.

Other people have told me they are not good enough. Well, join the club. Most of the followers of Jesus follow him precisely because they are not good enough.

Others say they are not religious, and let me say this again and again: 'Nor am I'. Religion is a system of belief and a way of following a set of rules. However, Jesus said: "I am the way, the truth and life." In other words, the Christian faith is about a person, Jesus, and about a relationship with an all-powerful God who deliberately gave himself for us, so that in exchange we can have a life worth living.

We have just celebrated Easter, Jesus' victory over death - that literally means no matter how difficult or dark life feels, in Jesus we have a sure hope of resurrection and new life. And it doesn't get more exciting or relevant than that.

So let me invite you to come to church, either again or for the first time. Do come and meet us - somebody recently said: 'You are not at all what I was expecting' - and I got the distinct impression they meant it as a compliment!

EAST END GABLE REPAIRS

In the April newsletter I reported that three contractors had submitted their offers, and that the Archdeacon had given her approval for Lodge & Sons to do the repairs. But then bad weather brought down more flints and an error was spotted in the specification in the area to be re-flinted, and the contractors were asked to tender again. This time Lodge & Sons could not meet our time requirements but Bakers of Danbury could, and furthermore they were now the cheapest!

A hurriedly set up meeting of the PCC was convened at which it approved our Architect, and Bakers as Contractor. As we now have enough funds to cover the revised costs, (see the item on the **APPEAL**) a start date of 22 April was set for the contractor so work should be in progress when you read this.

Because bats use the church, a survey by Natural England was carried out in January. The report said that their roost was inside, in the roof of the South Aisle at least 10m away from the location of the repair outside the building. It said the only safe time for the work, as far as the bats were concerned, was between 1 September and 31 October 2024. The Architect and the Contractor, have written to Natural England to say that this would lead to a Health and Safety issue., and that with due caution, they intended to keep to the original April/May period.
